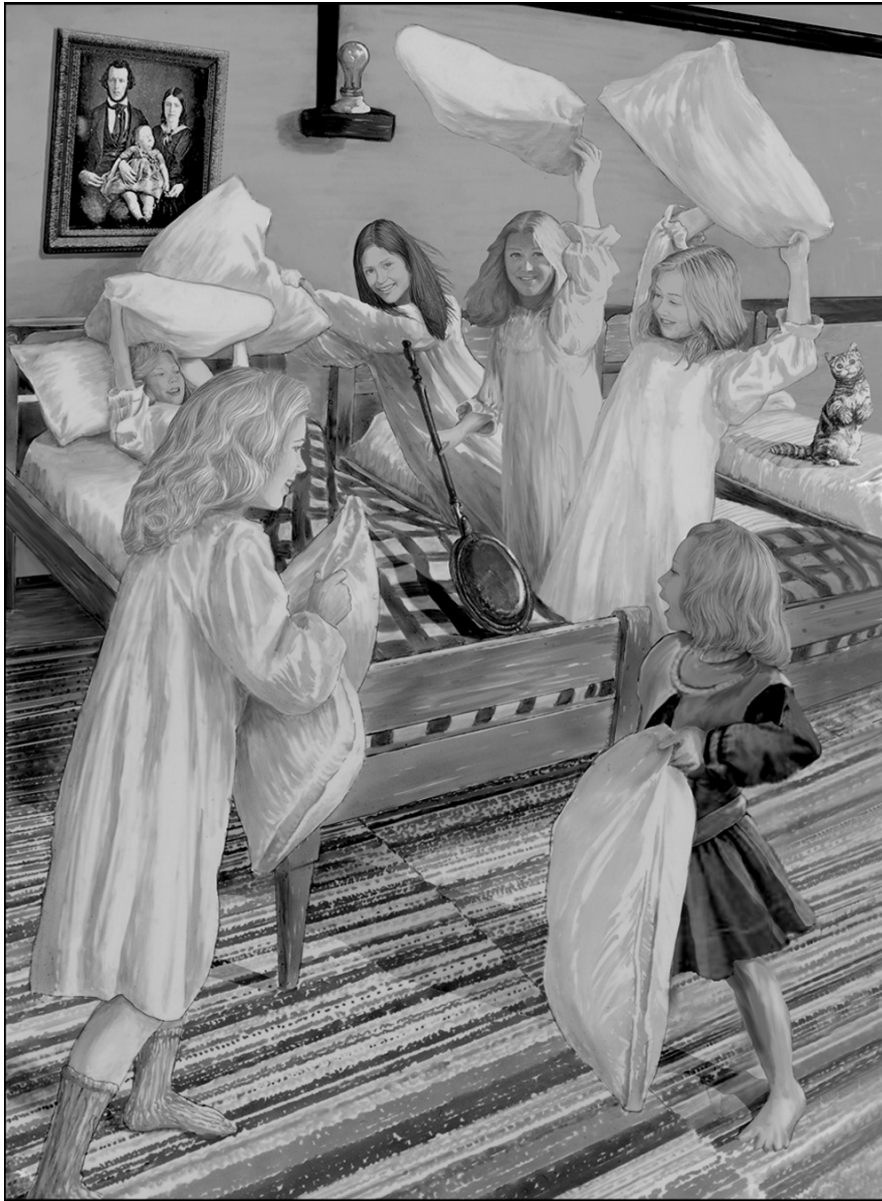


Fun with Illustrations
